#### 1.1 Accounting Convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention modified to include the revaluation of the golf course and clubhouse

#### 1.2 Membership Income

Annual membership income is recognised on an accruals basis

Life membership income is recognised on a receipts basis

#### 1.3 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation.

Depreciation is charged on reducing balance at the following rates:

#### Independent Auditors' Report to the Members of Kinsale Golf Club

#### **Opinion on the Financial Statements**

We have audited the financial statements of Kinsale Golf Club for the year ended 30 September 2022 which comprise the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet and the related notes, including the summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 1. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in Ireland.

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the assets, liabilities and financial position of the club as at 30 September 2022 and of its surplus for the year then ended; and
- have been properly prepared in accordance with in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in Ireland

#### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (Ireland) (ISAs (Ireland)) and applicable law. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the club in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Ireland, including the FRC's Ethical Standard, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### Conclusions Relating to Going Concern

In auditing the financial statements, we have concluded that the Management Committee's use of the going concern basis of accounting in the preparation of the financial statements is appropriate.

Based on the work we have performed, we have not identified any material uncertainties relating to events or conditions that, individually or collectively, may cast significant doubt on the club's ability to continue as a going concern for a period of at least twelve months from the date when the financial statements are authorised for issue.

Our responsibilities and the responsibilities of the Management Committee with respect to going concern are described in the relevant sections of this report.

#### Other Information

The Management Committee is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the annual report, other than the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and, except to the extent otherwise explicitly stated in our report, we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon. In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If we identify such material inconsistencies or apparent material misstatements, we are required to determine whether there is a material misstatement in the financial statements or a material misstatement of the other information. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact.

Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements. - 2.3 Accept and recognize the Royal and Ancient golf Club of St. Andrews as the sole Authority for prescribing and implementing the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status.
- 2.4 Provide facilities for the playing and promotion of amateur games of golf by men, women, juveniles and juniors and generally to promote amateur games among its members.

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- 2.5 The Club will at all times encourage and promote juniors and juveniles in playing the game of golf.
- 2.6 Generally to act in the promotion and advancement of the affairs of the Club and the improvement of the facilities available to members.

#### Be amended to read

#### **B.2** Objectives

- 2.1 The club will be affiliated to Golf Ireland, the National Governing Body for Golf in Ireland. The Club shall be bound by the Constitution, Bye Laws and rules of Golf Ireland.
- 2.2 Accept and apply the Handicapping Scheme as prescribed by Golf Ireland and such rules thereunder as may require to be implemented from time to time by Golf Ireland.
- 2.3 Accept and recognise the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews as the sole Authority for prescribing and implementing the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status.
- 2.4 Provide facilities for the playing and promotion of amateur games of golf by men, women, juveniles and juniors and generally to promote amateur games among its members.
- 2.5 The Club will, at all times, encourage and promote juniors and juveniles in playing the game of golf.
- 2.6 Generally, to act in the promotion and advancement of the affairs of the Club and the improvement of the facilities available to members.

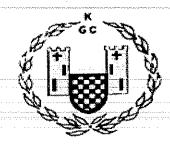
